Recipes

Sharon Riggs shares a favorite recipe from her mother, Margaret.

Chocolate Dessert

- 1 c. flour
- 1 c. pecans, chopped
- 1 stick margarine, softened
- 2 c. powdered sugar, or as needed
- 1 c. cool whip light
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 oz. instant chocolate pudding
- 1 oz instant vanilla pudding, small
- 3 c. milk
- 2 c. cool whip light
- ¹/₂ c. pecans, chopped
- ½ c. semisweet baking chocolate

Crust: Mix flour, chopped pecans, and margarine. Pat into a 9 x 13 pan. Bake at 350 for 20 min. Cool. First layer: Mix powdered sugar, cool whip, vanilla, and cream cheese. Pour over cooled crust. 2nd layer: Mix puddings and milk until thickened. Pour over cheese layer. 3rd layer: Spread remainder of cool whip over top and garnish with chopped pecans and shaved chocolate. Chill.

The recipe for Peach Cream Cheese Pie which was shared in the April issue had two errors. The amount of sugar to mix with the vanilla pudding and flour, etc. should have been 1/4 c. The second error was that a line of instruction was omitted. Please insert this sentence into the recipe instructions. We regret these errors and hope that you will have good success in making this delicious recipe!
